

# Power Pictures Privacy Statement for the Tommy Tiernan Show

At Power Pictures we are committed to protecting and respecting your privacy.

This Privacy Statement will let you know how we look after the personal data which we collect from you in connection with your application for tickets to, and attendance at, the Tommy Tiernan Show. This Privacy Statement also informs you as to our obligations and your rights under data protection law.

## 1. Who is responsible for your personal data?

For the purposes of the EU General Data Protection Regulation (EU Regulation 679/2016) (the “**GDPR**”), Power Pictures Limited is the data controller with regard to the personal data described in this Privacy Statement.

“**Data controllers**” are the people who or organisations which determine the purposes for which, and the manner in which, any personal data is processed, who/which make independent decisions in relation to the personal data and/or who/which otherwise control that personal data.

In particular, we have appointed a Privacy Officer within Power Pictures to monitor compliance with our data protection obligations and with this Privacy Statement and related policies. If you have any questions about this policy or about our data protection compliance please [contact us](#).

## 2. What personal data do we collect?

“**Personal data**” means any information relating to an identified or identifiable natural person. Personal data can be factual (for example, a name, address or date of birth) or it can be an opinion about that person, their actions and/or behaviour.

Audience members:

We will collect and process the following personal data from people applying to be audience members:

- Name
- Email
- Phone number
- Your preferences with regard to receiving information from us
- Images

We do not collect any special categories of personal data from you.

#### Contributors

We will collect and process the following personal data from contributors to the show:

- Name
- Address
- Email
- Phone number
- Bank account details
- Images

We do not collect any special categories of personal data from you.

### **3. How do we collect your personal data?**

#### Audience members

When you fill out an application form for tickets to the Tommy Tiernan Show you provide us with your name, phone number and email address.

Where an individual fills out an application form for multiple tickets, that individual will provide us with the names and phone numbers of the other people who will be attending. Before attending the show you will be asked to complete a COVID-19 acknowledgement form confirming your contact details for the purpose of contacting tracing and also acknowledging that you understand the restrictions on certain categories of persons attending the show in accordance with public health guidance.

Your images may be captured during the filming of the show.

#### Contributors

You provide us with the above personal data when we enter into agreements with you in relation to the contribution you provide to the show. Your images will be collected during the filming of the show.

Before attending the show you will be asked to complete a COVID-19 acknowledgement form confirming your contact details for the purpose of contacting tracing and also acknowledging that you understand the restrictions on certain categories of persons attending the show in accordance with public health guidance

### **4. For what purposes do we process your personal data and what is our legal basis?**

We have set out below, in a table format, a description of all the ways we plan to use your personal data, and which of the legal bases we rely on to do so.

You will see that we rely on legitimate interests as our legal basis for some of the processing we have carried out. We have carried out a balancing test, weighing the interests of ourselves, audience members at our events, the individuals/groups for whom we produce the shows and the general public against any potential risks arising from the processing of personal data. We will not process any personal data if the risks to that data outweigh the legitimate interests in favour of processing it. Where we rely on consent as a legal basis, you may withdraw consent at any time by [contacting us](#).

Withdrawal of consent shall be without effect to the lawfulness of processing based on consent before its withdrawal.

### Contributors

Name, address, email, phone number	We will communicate with you to inform you if you have been selected to provide contribution and to send you any relevant information with regard to the show, or where it may be necessary to do so for the purposes of contact tracing in the event someone else attending the show tests positive for COVID-19.	Necessary for the purposes of performing our contract with you as we need to be able to contact you in relation to the show and your contributions, or otherwise as necessary in the public interest to allow contact tracing to be carried out.
Financial details	For the purposes of paying you for your contribution.	Necessary for the purposes of performing our contract with you as we require your financial details in order to pay you as agreed.
Images	Where the show is being filmed your contribution will be captured on film. These may be broadcast on television and/or used subsequently for promotional purposes.	Necessary for the purposes of performing our contract with you. Your contribution being filmed is the purpose of the contract we enter into with you.

## 5. Do we share your personal data with anyone else?

We may share your personal data with the following parties in connection with our processing of your personal data:

Third party	Reason for sharing data
Broadcasters	We will provide the recordings to broadcasters including RTE in order for them to be broadcast on television.  We will also provide broadcasters such as RTE with copies of release forms signed by contributors and the talent agreements signed by contributors.
Jotform	Our COVID-19 acknowledgement form uses the Jotform online form platform, and the information you provide on that form are processed by Jotform in order to provide that service.
Public health authorities	In the event that a person attending the set tests positive for COVID-19, it may be necessary to share your contact details with the HSE for the purpose of contact tracing.

We require all third parties to enter into a data processing agreement with us which complies with our obligations under the GDPR. This agreement requires third parties to have appropriate security systems in place and only to use your personal data on our instructions and in accordance with data protection law.

## 6. Keeping your personal data secure

We take appropriate security measures against unlawful or unauthorised processing of personal data, and against the accidental loss of, or damage to, personal data. We limit access to your personal data to those employees, agents and other third parties who are required to have access to your personal data and where they have agreed that they are subject to a duty of confidentiality.

We have put in place procedures and technologies to maintain the security of all personal data from the point of collection to the point of destruction. We have procedures in place to deal with actual and suspected data breaches which include an obligation on us to notify the supervisory authority and/or you, the data subject, where legally required to do so.

## 7. Transferring personal data out of the EEA

We do not transfer your personal data out of the EEA.

## 8. For how long do we keep your personal data?

Your personal data will be deleted when it is no longer reasonably required for the purposes described [above](#).

Where we rely on your consent as a legal basis for processing we will delete your personal data as soon as possible after you withdraw your consent.

## 9. Your data protection rights

Under certain circumstances, by law you have the right to:

- **Request information** about whether we hold personal information about you, and, if so, what that information is and why we are holding/using it.
- **Request access** to your personal information (commonly known as a "data subject access request"). This enables you to receive a copy of the personal information we hold about you and to check that we are lawfully processing it.
- **Request correction** of the personal information that we hold about you. This enables you to have any incomplete or inaccurate information we hold about you corrected.
- **Request erasure** of your personal information. This enables you to ask us to delete or remove personal information where there is no good reason for us continuing to process it. You also have the right to ask us to delete or remove your personal information where you have exercised your right to object to processing (see below).
- **Object to processing** of your personal information where we are relying on a legitimate interest (or those of a third party) and there is something about your particular situation which makes you want to object to processing on this ground. You also have the right to object where we are processing your personal information for direct marketing purposes.
- **Object to automated decision-making** including profiling, that is not to be the subject of any automated decision-making by us using your personal information or profiling of you. We do not engage in any automated decision making.
- **Request the restriction of processing** of your personal information. This enables you to ask us to suspend the processing of personal information about you, for example if you want us to establish its accuracy or the reason for processing it.
- **Request transfer of your personal information** in an electronic and structured form to you or to another party (commonly known as a right to "**data portability**"). This enables you to take your data from us in an electronically useable format and to be able to transfer your data to another party in an electronically useable format.

In the event that you wish to make a complaint about how your personal data is being processed by Power Pictures, or how your complaint has been handled, you have the right to lodge a complaint directly with the supervisory authority who can be contacted as follows:
